1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m.

2. Approval of Agenda

Motion made by Cory DeMuth, seconded by Peter Sauter to approve the May 2025 Radio TOC meeting agenda. Motion carried.

3. Approval of April 2025 Meeting Minutes

Motion made by DeMuth, seconded by Sauter to approve the April 2025 Radio TOC meeting minutes. Motion carried.

4. Action Items

A. COMU Recognitions/Renewals

i. Mark Erickson COML Initial Recognition

Tracey Fredrick said that Mark Erickson is seeking initial recognition for COML. Erickson works for South Metro Fire and has agency support to be recognized. He has completed the task book and turned in all required documents and certificates.

Motion made by Sauter, seconded by DeMuth to approve the initial COML recognition of Mark Erickson, Motion carried.

ii. Jake Thompson COML/COMT Renewal

Fredrick said that Jake Thompson is seeking a COML and COMT renewal. Thompson currently works for Hennepin County and has agency support to continue serving as a COML and COMT. He is earning points for serving as a COML and COMT for events and authoring ICS 205s.

Motion made by Nate Timm, seconded by Ron Jansen to approve the COML and COMT renewal of Jake Thompson. Motion carried.

B. Scott County Participation Plan Amendment

Scott Haas said Scott County is asking for approval of an amendment to its ARMER participation plan. The City of Shakopee has seen considerable commercial and industrial development in the area surrounding Canterbury Park and Valley Fair. A coverage evaluation identified this area as having numerous issues. A new ARMER enhancement site was approved for 801 Canterbury Road, Shakopee, Minnesota. The County has contracted with Motorola Solutions to provide a 16-channel simulcast RF subsite using "D" series base radio equipment. The new subsite will be connected to the Norwood/Young America prime site (zone 1, site 4) via redundant fiber optic connections. The same ARMER RF channel set already deployed in the NYA subnet will be deployed at the proposed new Canterbury tank site. Scott County will apply for FCC licensing for the subsite addition following MESB and Statewide Radio Board review. Pending appropriate approvals and FCC licensing, the Canterbury site is expected to be operational sometime in the 4th quarter of 2025. Scott County is responsible for funding the project.

Timm asked if Scott County would be using state funding to finance the project.

Haas said that the county will be using ARPA grant money.

Motion made by Jansen, seconded by DeMuth to approve the Scott County Participation Plan Amendment. Motion carried.

C. Discussion: West MRCC Talkgroup Encryption

Fredrick said that HEMS would like to encrypt the West MRCC talkgroup 2. Currently, they would like to add an additional channel to use for approximately one year, until Burnsville and Edina FDs are transitioned to encryption. At that time, the clear WMRCC2 would sunset. West MRCC1 would not be impacted.

Thompson said making a decision as a region would be most beneficial. He asked if EMS agencies would be impacted by the encryption upgrades.

Victoria Vadnais said that this should not impact EMS agencies assuming they keep one talkgroup channel without encryption open and available.

Haas said that the standard will need to be updated and approved at a future Radio TOC meeting.

Motion made by Timm, seconded by Jansen to approve the West MRCC talkgroup encryption with the guidance of updating the standard at the following June 2025 Radio TOC meeting. Motion carried.

5. Moves, Additions, and Changes to the System

Mike Parker said Chisago County is working on AES encryption capability upgrades for fall of 2025.

6. Committee Reports

A. System Managers Group/Metro Administrators

Jansen said the group met on May 28. Motorola needs the spare lists by June 16. Discussion on the upcoming upgrade and timing with Phase 1 running 9-29 through 10-10-25, Phase 2 running 10-21 through 10-31-25. MnDOT gave an update on the Juniper upgrades.

B. MnDOT ARMER System Update

There is no new update.

C. SECB Committees

i. Steering

Fredrick said the committee met in May and continued to review needs and documents for the SECB Policy and Procedure Manual and SCIP planning. The June meeting for this committee has been cancelled.

ii. LMR

Timm said they met on May 13 and discussed numerous participation plan amendments, SUA planning and StatusBoard and BDA/DAS Best Practices workgroups continue to meet.

iii. WBBA

Rod Olson said they met on May 20 and discussed the scheduling of Verizon and T-Mobile coverage presentations. SCIP plan updates were also discussed.

iv. IOC/COMU-STR Workgroup

Jansen said the workgroup met and discussed their new vendor for SCIP goals. The group also discussed VHF radios.

v. IPAWS

Haas said they met on May 15. They originally met quorum but due to tornado warnings numerous members had to leave. The group is working on training standards and a minimum alert criteria standard.

vi. Finance/Grants Workgroup

Fredrick said they met earlier in May. A SECB budget planning meeting was held after the regular meeting to address funding recommendations for the 2026-2027 biennium, upcoming SCIP planning meetings, and how the SECB will be structured in the future. Staff planning needs were also discussed. The School Mapping grant application closed on May 16 and is expected to be awarded in June. The SECB biennial grant closes on June 30; at this time, it is undetermined how the next biennial grant will be categorized.

7. Other Business

A. ME TAC Permissions Update

Fredrick said there are no new permissions requested.

8. Adjourn

The meeting was adjourned at 1:33 p.m.

Section 1: Overview

<u>US Customs and Border Protection</u> (<u>USCBP</u>) operates throughout the State of Minnesota. Concentrated primarily in the Twin Cities, and the Minneapolis-Saint Paul International Airport, USCBP's mission is to protect and secure the nation's borders.

<u>USCBP</u> is seeking ARMER system access to achieve interoperable Land Mobile Radio (LMR) communications with Minnesota public safety agencies that operate within the Metropolitan Emergency Services Board (MESB) region.

As an ARMER system interoperability plan participant, <u>USCBP</u> will not utilize ARMER system equipment and resources for any purposes other than achieving interoperable LMR communications with Minnesota public safety agencies involved in emergency and disaster response operations.

As an ARMER system interoperability plan participant, <u>USCBP</u> will not be authorized to utilize ARMER system for internal day-to-day, administrative and non-emergency communications purposes, except where otherwise approved by the Statewide Emergency Communications Board (SECB).

Section 2: ARMER System Participation Eligibility

As a public safety service provider, <u>USCBP</u> is eligible to utilize the ARMER system for interoperable LMR communication purposes under SECB Standard LMR-41 (Requesting Participation and Participation Plan Changes).

Section 3: Governance

As an ARMER system interoperability plan participant, <u>USCBP</u> will:

- Not utilize ARMER system equipment and resources until this plan has been approved by the SECB and a fully executed agreement with the contracting entity (Minnesota Department of Transportation) has been completed.
- Engage in regular communication and interaction with representatives from the SECB, the Metro ECB, the Minnesota Department of Public Safety, division of Emergency

Communication Networks (MN DPS-ECN), and the contracting entity regarding matters related to ARMER system interoperability and their participation status.

Seek the approval of the SECB, the Metro ECB, MN DPS-ECN, and/or the contracting entity prior to making any changes to the provisions of this plan.

Section 4: Technology - ARMER System Equipment

As an ARMER system user, <u>USCBP</u> will furnish the following equipment to support their access to the ARMER system:
