C. Metro Encryption Best Practices Guide Adoption

Fredrick said there was a request from local PSAPs and a recommendation from last summer's civil unrest after-action report to create a Best Practices Guide for entities switching over to radio encryption. This is meant to be a guide not prescriptive to how each entity accomplishes that change. The Radio TOC work group recommends changes prior to the cut-over. If approved, this document will be posted on the MESB website.

Curt Meyer said Hennepin County supported this effort. It really made a difference when there was a switch over to encrypted mains at Hennepin County. It is a good step-by-step procedure to go through the process.

Curt Meyer motioned to approve the Metro Encryption Best Practices Guide. Mark VandenBerghe seconded. Motion carried.

Fredrick said that M Health Fairview was to be moved completely onto the ARMER system as of Monday, April 26, 2021.

6. Committee Reports

A. Metro Mobility System Usage Update

Clay Stenback said ridership is down about 40% depending on the day of the week; with no upticks noticed.

B. System Owners Group Update – no update

D. SECB Committees

i. Steering

Jill Rohret said the Steering Committee met in April. Discussions included how the statewide strategic plan might connect to the regional plans. The Board approved. Committee chairs and potentially one technical expert representing one committee will be invited. All the regional planning sessions have been concluded. Each region will be putting together their plan with the help of ECN. The Metro Region has declined ECN's assistance. That information will be on the May Radio TOC agenda.

ii. LMR

Mike Mihelich said the LMR Committee met in April. Action items included the Egan Fire Waiver, Cass County, North Dakota wide area permissions, State Patrol MCC 7500e request, ARMER system interoperability participation plan for Onalaska Fire Department and Mercy One Airmed. There was discussion on Standard LMR-3; multi-group-talkgroup names. There was a Northeast region talkgroup change request, a Homeland Security and Immigration subscriber increase request, a Rochester/Olmsted County Dispatch request, and a Swift County plan amendment request.

iii. WBBA - no update

iv. IOC & Workgroups a. IOC – no meeting

b. STR Workgroup – no meeting

Curt Meyer said the chair is asking for direction for the group. Next meeting is June 1st.

c. COMU Workgroup - no update

v. IPAWS

Scott Haas said the workgroup met April 27. Templates are being created that are available for some of the most commonly used messages for emergency wireless alerts. Templates should be available in the next couple of months for Hazmat, civil unrest, flood, and no travel winter storm advisories.

vi. Finance/Grants Workgroup

Fredrick said both groups met in in March and April. The TCPR grant was fully executed and PSAPs are conducting those trainings. The current SECB grant ends in June. ECN has also applied for next year's SHSP grants. Cybersecurity and exercising are high priority. There was a discussion on the FCC strike force, and if Minnesota would be a diversionary state.

7. Other Business

A. METAC Permission update

Fredrick said Cook and Sibley counties were granted access to the clear channels and special permissions for the encrypted channels due to the civil unrest response, though neither county has programmed them. Both entities have been notified if they want permanent permission to submit request to the Radio TOC.

The City of Owatonna and several other EMS entities have also been granted emergency permissions for civil unrest response with encrypted channels. Others included were Hennepin EMS, North Memorial, M Health, Allina, and Ridgeview, and have also been notified if they want permanent permission to submit request to the Radio TOC.

Ron Jansen asked if the keys get put into the radios or downloaded into the keyloaders. Curt Meyer said Hennepin EMS updated consoles and provided keys for them. North Memorial was provided with access, but they had not responded.

Jansen said the keys need to be kept track of the way Scott County does theirs.

Meyer asked Fredrick if there was a way to verify if an agency has removed the temporary resources.

Fredrick said she will provide emails sent to those entities that states the dates the temporary permissions are to be used. There is not a current process in place to ensure the keys have been removed, outside of what is listed in current standard and talkgroup permissions.

Nick Schatz asked Fredrick if there is a list of who did the programming and has the keys.

Fredrick said she has the list of who requested access, with the assumption many did their own programming or reached out to other metro owners for assistance. Meyer said he will have someone from Hennepin pull out the keys given to Hennepin EMS.

Rohret said that Ridgeview was given permission but did not implement the encryption algorithm. Allina worked with Mike Mihelich but it is thought they did not implement. Rohret said it is not known how Owatonna, Sibley and Cook counties accessed the key. Suggestions for tracking this would be appreciated.

Fredrick said she got a call last week from Dave Theis who was helping M Health. Fredrick told Theis that since the incident was passed, M Health would need to come forward with special requests now. Nate Timm said M Health was loaned a cache radio with ME TAC 12 E and has since returned that radio.

Scott Haas asked if there was any movement on the change management process. Jake Thompson said Metro is following along with the state. Jansen said this was brought up at the LMR, but they are now supposed to be in the financial planning stage. It will probably be several years out before there are changes to the change management process.

Olson said with the newest after-action report, it might be a good time to start the change process over.

Timm said a date has been set for discussions on lessons learned with stake holders. There will be more metro and state TACs encryption discussions.

Marcus Bruning said the will be held in the afternoon of May 13th.

B. Regional Strategic Planning Radio Workgroup

Fredrick said the region has completed their planning sessions. Volunteers are needed to review some of the radio items to develop goals and objectives in the next month, so it can be presented to the Board in July.

Meyer, Jansen and Mihelich volunteered. Fredrick will send a WebEx invite.

C. METCOM Encryption

Curt Meyer said there have been several operational security discussions since Operation Safety Net and how wide open METCOM is in the metro area. This radio resource should not be in any subscriber radios. However, there are metro subscriber radios being used for recording.

Meyer asked what the group's thoughts were for encrypting this resource.

Jansen said he was for encrypting. It is in the MESB cache radios because there is the potential for using them if PSAP links are down.

Mihelich said he agrees but there needs to be a discussion with all the EMS agencies on a timeline.

Meyer said agencies are going to have to add encryption to consoles, maybe this becomes the pathway to the AES algorithm.

Jansen said some of the VPMs that have been loaded only have DES; this could impact PSAPs differently.

Olson said perhaps a temporary solution would be that recordings could only be allowed centrally as an AES.

Thompson asked if a work group should be formed to focus on who has AES and DES and to come up with a short-term and long-term plan.

Jansen said once the talk group is out there it's out there. The problem will not go away without a policy that says what happens if an entity is in violation

Meyer said there are some people that are not asking for permission to use certain resources.

Haas said he suggested a new talkgroup be formed connection to the AES encryption. It would be deployed to all the permitted users prior to disconnecting the current version of METCOM.

Jansen said adding a new talkgroup, was a good idea but is concerned about the loading capacity.

Thompson said there will have to be some collaboration on this.

Meyer said because of the size of the project it would require a work group. Fredrick will send out an email requesting volunteers for this work group.

Mihelich asked that in the interim if ME TAC 12E that was provided for PSAP-to-PSAP use during unrest could be reserved.

Thompson said he will bring this up to the 9-1-1 TOC for discussion.

Haas asked if the proposal to use METAC 12E is meant to replace METCOM. A variance to be given to non-law enforcement PSAPs until further notice or is the intent to provide a secondary PSAP-to-PSAP method of communication.

Thompson said he thought it would be used as an interim solution.

Olson asked if another solution would be to form a completely different non-encrypted talkgroup and not allow this one to go into a portable.

Mihelich said that a backup is necessary.

Meyer, Jansen and Shogren volunteered to be part of the new work group.

Section 3 – Metro 3.17.4 Non-emergent Event and Exercise Planning

1. Purpose or Objective

The purpose of this standard is to establish protocols and procedures to be used for planning communications for full-scale or functional exercises and non-emergent/pre-planned events that affect multiple metro agencies or jurisdictions in the Metro region. This standard will also specify procedures for using statewide or metro-wide talkgroups during these types of events.

2. Operational Background

Full-scale or functional exercises and pre-planned events that include multi-jurisdictional, multiagency disciplines, and use of more than one statewide and/or regional interoperability talkgroups require an All-Hazards, Type III Communications Unit Leader (COML) to establish a communication plan.

Non-emergent/pre-planned events are scheduled, non-emergency activities as defined by the national incident management system. These events include, but are not limited to, a sporting event, concert, or parade.

A full-scale exercise (FSE) is a multi-agency, multi-jurisdictional, multi-discipline exercise involving a functional and/or field unit response. A functional response could include a joint field office, emergency operations center (EOC), etc. A field unit response could include firefighters or other first responders at a scene, along with mock victims, etc.

A functional exercise (FE) examines and/or validates the coordination, command, and control between various multi-agency coordination centers, such as an EOC, joint field office, etc. A functional exercise does not involve any field unit responders. Use of radio talkgroups should begin with the highest number available at the time (ex: ME TAC 10) and go towards the lowest.

Refer to Metro ARMER Standard 3.21.0 (Large Scale Incidents) for emergent events and/or Metro ARMER Standard 3.48.0 and SECB Standard IOP-30 (Communications Unit) and the Minnesota Communications Unit Standard Operating Guidelines for additional information about COMLs.

3. Operational Context

Full-scale or functional exercises and pre-planned events of any size can include complex communications issues. There is also a potential for any event to grow quickly into a large-scale incident. Refer to Metro ARMER Standard 3.21.0 (Large Scale Incidents) for emergent events.

Since full-scale/functional exercises and pre-planned events have the potential to affect system loading, a COML should ensure that the event does not inadvertently affect normal, daily operational needs by over-utilization and/or overloading of ARMER system resources.

4. Recommended Procedure

When an entity develops a plan for a full-scale/functional exercise or preplanned event that involves the use of ARMER resources, these procedures will be followed:

• StatusBoard must be utilized. When the exercise or event is planned farther out than seven days, the requested resource should be reserved on the StatusBoard at least one week in advance, but not more than one month in advance.

• Exercise or event planners will include the impacted local entities' (city or county) ARMER System Administrators in the exercise development process from the beginning so local system resources are properly utilized.

• Exercise or event planners intending to use more than one statewide interoperability talkgroup shall engage a Metro-based Minnesota-recognized COML.

• A COML engaged for an exercise or event during which planners intend to use two or more statewide and/or regional interoperability talkgroup shall complete or approve an ICS-205 Communications Plan and that plan should be distributed to the ARMER System Administrators of impacted local entities, the Chair of the Radio Technical Operations Committee, the applicable Regional Interoperability Coordinator, and the Statewide Interoperability Coordinator.

• A COML engaged for an exercise or event during which planners intend to use two or more statewide and/or regional interoperability talkgroup should take into consideration the home zone mapping, priority levels, talkgroup patching, site loading, and site access approvals of talkgroups being considered as well as the channel count and capacity of impacted repeater sites.

If the event or exercise planner deems the services of a COML necessary but does not have access to one, the Radio Systems Coordinator or the Minnesota Duty Officer should be contacted.

5. Management

The system managers, administrators, and users will all be responsible to see that this policy is implemented as defined. Identified issues and concerns will be brought to the impacted Technical Operations Committee (TOC) for resolution. Maintenance of this standard will be the responsibility of the Radio Services Coordinator.

- Workgroup has already been formed with MnDOT to review and form plans for field deployment.
- Assistance provided to entities who are not system administrators; funding mechanism for how this would occur.

Priority #3: Explore options for TDMA

 There is a desire to increase capacity within current FCC licensing limitations as 800 mHZ licenses are becoming fewer.

• Explore cost benefit of implementation of TDMA

Organizational Activities

- Work with vendor to negotiate these items into new agreement.

Priority #4: Keep ARMER System Current

• For public safety, mission critical positions, the ARMER network is currently the only viable communications solution. Other networks are not public safety grade and do not have the reliability or redundancies in place that ARMER does. It is imperative to keep ARMER current until another viable and dependable solution is operational and cost effective.

Organizational Activities

• Continued advocacy and outreach to local and statewide partners.
