1. Call to Order

Jake Thompson, Radio Chair called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

2. Approval of Agenda

B. Acceptance of Operation Safety Net After Action Report

Jill Rohret said the final draft was approved by the 9-1-1 TOC last week. That draft was revised to correct 2 typos and change a specifically named channel to "a regional channel".

Motion made by Curt Meyer to accept Operation Safety Net After Action Report with recommended changes. Nick Schatz seconded. Motion carried.

C. Election of 2022 Radio TOC Chair and Vice-Chair

Motion made by Curt Meyer to approve Jake Thompson as 2022 Radio TOC Chair. Cory DeMuth seconded Motion carried.

Motion made by Jeff Bjorklund to approve Ron Jansen as 2022 Radio TOC Vice-Chair. Nick Schatz seconded Motion carried.

D. Appointment to SECB Committees for 2022

Motion made by Rod Olson to appoint Nate Timm as Primary and Curt Meyer as Alternate to the Land Mobile Radio Committee. Mark VandenBerghe seconded. Motion carried.

Motion made by Cory DeMuth to appoint Rod Olson as Primary and Jake Thompson as Alternate to the Wireless Broadband and Applications Committee. Jeff Bjorklund seconded. Motion carried.

Motion made by Victoria Vadnais to appoint Jake Thompson as Primary and Nate Timm as Alternate to the Interoperability Committee. Mark VandenBerghe seconded. Motion carried.

E. 2022 Meeting Dates

Tracey Fredrick said the 2022 Radio TOC meeting dates follow what has been standard, fourth Wednesday each month, except in November, which will be the third Wednesday. The April 2022 meeting has a potential conflict with the Public Safety Conference. That meeting date discussion will be discussed again when the date gets closer.

Motion made by Curt Meyer to approve 2022 Radio TOC meeting dates. Jeff Bjorklund seconded. Motion carried.

5. Moves, Additions & Changes to the System

Rod Olson said that the Minneapolis 9-1-1 back-up center is going forward but there is a change to use existing T1s instead of fiber. The concern is that there may not be a November Radio TOC meeting to approve this change. He will bring a schematic to the next Radio TOC meeting.

Rohret said to be prepared to get a waiver and/or a variance if this was to go forward before MESB and SECB approval and the 9-1-1 side will need to do a plan change.

Olson asked if he should write something up for the next LMR meeting saying all the necessary approval are not yet in place.

Rohret said the LMR can always take action pending MESB approval, but that will not be until the January 2022 meeting.

Curt Meyer said there are items that might cause outages on the north end of the Hennepin County. The Rogers tower site will be connected by fiber rather than microwave. County Board move forward on the patrol division replacement. There is a discussion on whether to leave a portion of the building or put a smaller building there. Leaving a portion of the building would minimize the outage. The patrol division will be joined to the county building on the northwest corner.

Olson said the state is doing a change out tomorrow to main site downtown.

Chad LeVasseur said numbers remain low. Ridership is near 80% of pre-pandemic ridership.

Nate Timm said at the October 12 meeting. There were some ECN sponsored webinar series announced. Regional leadership meeting was discussed. Carver County CCGW plan was approved. Isanti County had a participation plan change approved. LaCrosse County was approved for more radio IDs. MnDOT was approved for Harris Radios that were tested. There was a discussion on SCIP goals.

iii. WBBA

Rod Olson said the WBBA met October 19. SCIP goals were discussed and voted to send the final draft to the Steering Committee. Dave Pike was voted in as the new Vice-Chair. An FCC 9-1-1 Strike Force report indicated there was not much written about cellular, so it does not affect the WBBA much. The committee had said there was a need for more documentation about where FirstNet is headed. There was a recorded speech from Jennifer Harder.

Nate Timm said the COMU work group met on October 19. Some renewals for COMU positions were processed.

Tracey Fredrick said the Finance Committee discussed the FCC fee diversion report, and some regional governance and funding support. The Grants Work Group discussed some SECB grants for next year. The metro is currently allotted \$250,000.00 for January 2022 through June 2023.

Victoria Vadnais asked if there were any updates for PSAPs on fee diversion.

Fredrick said there is less concern now about how Minnesota will use the 9-1-1 fee. Fredrick will send Vadnais the FCC report.

7A. METAC Permission update

Fredrick said there were no new permissions requested last month.

Rod Olson said there had been talk of creating a new encrypted talk group.

Rohret said action was delayed until the 9-1-1 TOC gave their opinion. That item was included in questions for the MESB/9-1-1 consultant. Mike Mihelich can make that report available to you if you would want to form a work group.

B. BCA Security Discussion

Jake Thompson said Jon Eckel sent him the updated network security policy the BCA came up with. There is a statement in their policy that discusses radio traffic.

Olson said this concerning because it greatly affects metro radio and there has been no discussion between the BCA and metro system administrators.

Susan Bowler clarified it would be AES encryption.

Rohret asked if this was an alert to be in compliance by a certain time? It would be appropriate that the SECB get some clarification on this topic.

After the conclusion of discussion, Jeff Bjorklund stated he has taken a new position at MAC and will be leaving the TOC when his replacement is hired.

Tracey and Mike please add this request to the next Radio and 911 TOC meetings.

The City of Minneapolis would like to change our participation plan and request additional connections for a backup 911 center and we seek the approval of the MESB for this new backup PSAP. The City of Minneapolis was one of the first ARMER sub system and console owners on the system starting in 2001.

Radio TOC: At this time we would like to add a backup 911 dispatch site with 7 radio dispatch positions that will be IP based Motorola MCC 7500e consoles with "Cryptor" encryption modules. We hope to have this work completed this year. The City will continue to use local analog equipment for logging of radio talk groups and phones while looking for a long term logging solution in the future. This will use our backup radio consolettes for recording and will require two CCGW units with a total of 16 ports, 8 ports will be used at initial set up. The radio ID's to be used are within our current assignment so no new ID's are being requested. We have been in contact and discussion with MN DOT on this new site and until recently we thought this site would be one of the first console sites connected through ethernet. We have determined that the site will initially be set up as T1 connections. We are requesting to extend our current ARMER network connection point to new "Dark Fiber" connection through dedicated Single Mode Fiber to our new 911BU site at the Convention Center.

911 TOC: This new backup dispatch center includes twelve (12) VESTA 9-1-1 workstations which are part of Call Handling System 1 (CHS1). These 9-1-1 workstations are being relocated from the Third Precinct location to this new location. The 9-1-1 workstations will be integrated with the PSAP's CAD, Logging Recorder, and Radio systems. The new 9-1-1 workstations will be connected on customer-provided WAN facilities to each of the CHS1 Data Centers: Primary at the Sheriff's Office at Parkers Lake and Secondary at the Hennepin County Government Center Data Equipment Room.
