B. Anoka County Participation Plan Amendment

Val Sprynczynatyk introduced Cory DeMuth as the new Anoka County Radio System Coordinator.

Sprynczynatyk said Anoka County has used a portion of their CARES money to purchase five additional consoles. Currently, law enforcement is running mains out of the temporary space and the goal is to get police and all in one place; the training area will be converted to house the five new consoles. Anoka County is formally requesting approval of an amendment to its participation plan to add five new MCC7500 consoles. Currently Anoka County operates 14 dispatch positions. We will be increasing our console count to 19 MCC7500 consoles.

Nate Timm asked if the consoles were traditional models, as the MCC7550e models can be mobile and use wifi capabilities and they are cheaper. Sprynzynatyk said Anoka and Hennepin Counties purchased some MCC7500e consoles for shared events, such as the PGA . A new logging system was purchased with CARES money, and they are transitioning to NICE, as the old logger is at capacity.

Jake Thompson said there are fourteen operation positions in the plan, but only thirteen have been approved. Sprynzynatyk said that only five are being added.

Thompson asked if the area was R56 compliant. Sprynzynatyk said that it was.

Thompson asked if a level 2 system administrator has been identified to oversee the management of the local system. Sprynzynatyk said yes, Cory DeMuth and Kevin McDowlin from IT, and a NICE representative.

Timm asked that the correct number of positions be included in the motion.

Thompson asked that changes to the logging system be included in the plan request and motion.

Sprynczynatyk asked if a new plan request needed to be drawn up for the October meeting. Timm said he would make the motion with the understanding that the changes to the plan are made before presentation to the LMR, and also to provide a technical drawing from NICE.

Motion by Nate Timm to approve Anoka County Participation Plan Amendment concurrent upon LMR approval and the additional items for position number and logging. Victoria Vadnais seconded. Motion carried.

C. Multi-County MCC7500

Nick Schatz said this is a multi-agency request to add 2 link operator servers, a main and a standby.

Schatz said this partnership will provide backup dispatch consoles functionality that can be setup with mobile deployments, and/or for telecommute work environments.

Jansen asked how the interface will work with the encryption. Schatz said It will be housed locally on the devices. Rod Olson clarified that the 7500E's would not need encryption. Schatz said the devices themselves will have encryption, but the link ops will not need it.

Jansen motioned to approve the multi-county MCC7500. Mike Mihelich seconded. Motion carried.

D. Approval of Radio Grant Projects for 2021 Regional Funding Priorities

Fredrick said each year the Radio TOC approves the next year's grant funding priorities. Ongoing training has been a request in the past. Some quotes have been received from Motorola. Other discussions have included an updated video for ARMER training. The CRTF exercise and the attendance to the Minnesota Public Safety Communications conference are typically on each year's list.

Jansen asked if the COML cache radios all encrypted. Fredrick said that it her understanding they are.

Thompson said the need for remote devices should be considered, in light of current events.

Timm asked if any money needs to be returned. Fredrick said she did not believe this to be the case, as SHSP grant money is being used for Radio items, and SECB grant money is being used for 9-1-1 items. The entirety of the SECB grant has not yet been awarded.

Timm asked if BDAs could be considered for the list of funding priorities.

Jansen said he would put the priorities in order of radio training, CRTF exercise, Public Safety conference, ARMER video, laptop consoles, BDA request.


