1. Call to Order:

Scott Haas called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

2. Approval of Agenda

M/S/C – Peter Sauter moved to approve the amended agenda for September 25, 2019, Curt Meyer seconded. Motion carried.

3. Approval of Minutes

M/S/C – Jon Eckel moved to approve minutes from August 28, 2019. Sauter seconded. Motion carried.

4. Action Items

A. COMU Position Approvals

i. Steve Ouradnik COML Approval

Tracey Fredrick recommended the initial COML approval for Steve Ouradnik from the Department of Corrections be approved by the Radio TOC and move on to the state for approval.

M/S/C – Ron Jansen to moved to approve Steve Ouradnik COML application. Meyer seconded. Motion carried.

B. LifeLink Participation Plan Amendment

Paul Eaton said LifeLink III is requesting 10 additional radio ID's and 3 talkgroups on the ARMER system. These ID's and talkgroups will facilitate expansion in services already provided. The expanded services include a team of EMS agencies and the dispatch for that team. The additional talkgroup requests include one to make what LifeLink III is using current. The LMR has approved this Participation Plan Amendment.

Motion made by Jansen to approve 10 additional ID's and 3 talkgroups on the ARMER system for LifeLink III. Meyer seconded. Motion carried.

C. USPIS Interoperability Participation Plan Request

Marcus Bruning said the United States Postal Inspection Service (USPIS) is seeking to establish an interoperability communications agreement with their Minnesota public safety partners who use the ARMER system. This is a strictly an Interoperability agreement. They will park on their own system.

Olson asked if these users are considered public safety personnel. Bruning said they are. Jansen asked who would be doing the programming. Bruning said their system administrator is.

Motion made by Eckel, seconded by Olson to table this request and to return next month with the following answers:

Who will be sponsoring?
Who is the local administrator?
Concern about parking
Dual band radio concern
Who will give encryption keys
Local programming and sharing of the system
Motion carried.

D. Approval of Radio Grant Projects for 2020 Regional Funding Priorities

Fredrick said there are no different priorities from previous years. Aviat and Motorola Training are on the 2020 list again.

Motion made by Jansen to vote on the three priorities as CRTF, Aviat, and Motorola training.

Nate Timm asked if there was funding for the Interop conference.

Motion amended by Jansen to include funding for Interop conference. Seconded by Olson Motion carried.

5. Moves, Additions & Changes to the System

Jansen said that the Dakota County microwave is getting closer to completion. The Buck Hill system is completed, and Farmington High School also have installed BDAs.

Jake Thompson reported that the prior osprey issue has been resolved and that tower should be done next Monday, September 30. Anoka Hennepin schools are also installing an 800 band and adding BDAs.

6. Committee Reports

A. Metro Mobility System Usage Update

Chad LeVasseur said new microphones have been ordered for the new project and the first ones should arrive by the end of next week (first week of October).

Fredrick said that the bylaws discussion is drawing to an end and committees will be asked to take final action on the amended bylaws draft in October.

Fredrick said that the two members were unable to make the previous meeting, but it was mostly COMU position approvals. There was also a discussion about the statewide airborne repeater test and continued discussion about topics for the 2020 PSCC.

Fredrick said the majority of the meeting was about COMU approvals.

Scott Haas said IPAWS met at the AMEM conference. It was discussed putting on a workgroup based training to put on at the Governor's EM conference and possibly the APC and Communications conference.

Fredrick said the grants workgroup is meeting this upcoming Friday, September 27, where the main focus will be the two 9-1-1 grants and the 2020 grant cycle. There will also be a refresher on eGrants.

7. Other Business

A. 2 ICTAP Courses

Fredrick said that the state will be hosting a Cybersecurity Tabletop Exercise at the Stearns County Courthouse in St. Cloud on November 6. The state is seeking two ARMER System Administrators, PSAP Managers, Dispatchers, Law Enforcement, EMS and Fire volunteers.

The second training is an LMR encryption Webinar, hosted on October 2 and October 14. Both will run from 2-3 pm.

RE: LTACE's for the Burnsville Fire Chief

Dakota County is seeking a waiver to State Standard 3.19.0 "Use of 800 MHz Statewide LTAC and SIU Interoperability Talkgroups". The Burnsville Fire department was granted permission in early 2017 for three of its members to that are on the Burnsville SWAT team to access the encrypted talkgroups. These radios are assigned specifically to these three personnel only. Dakota County is seeking an additional permission to program these talkgroups into the Fire Chief's radio. There is frequently a need for the Fire Chief to be involved in the incident command vehicle and unified command structure. Allowing this waiver would significantly reduce the risk of the Chief not being on the same resource and reduce a safety risk for lost or missed communications.
